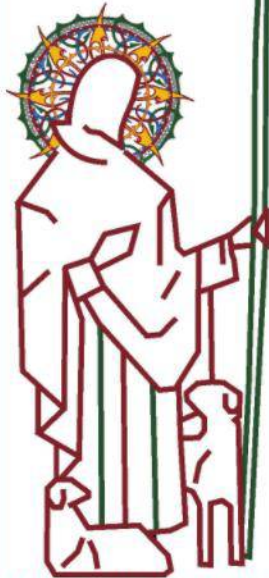

**Students in the First Grade or Younger:** Children must be in a religious education program for a minimum of one year before being allowed to prepare for First Reconciliation and First Holy Eucharist. If your child will be in the second grade in the 2016-17 school year, and is a baptized Catholic, please make sure they are in a religious education program this year or they will not be allowed to prepare for First Reconciliation and First Holy Eucharist in the second grade.

**Students in the Second Grade:** Second grade is the traditional age for sacramental preparation for First Reconciliation and First Holy Eucharist. If a child has not been participating in a religious education program before the second grade, they will need a year of religious education before they are able to prepare for First Reconciliation and First Holy Eucharist.

**Students in the Third Grade or Older:** Must have a minimum of one year in a religious education program the year prior to preparation for First Reconciliation, First Holy Eucharist, and Confirmation. For our middle school students—participation in Youth Life is considered religious education. Participation in religious education between First Holy Eucharist and Confirmation better prepares our Good Shepherd students to receive the formation and preparation for Confirmation.

**Students in Eighth Grade or Older:** Students must be in a religious education program the year prior to preparing for Confirmation in the ninth grade or later. (Youth Life is considered a religious education program.)

**CATHOLIC WEDDING LITURGIES – ILLICIT WEDDING UNIONS:** As a gentle reminder, the Catholic Church was established by Christ on His Apostle and Biblical teachings. Regarding Christian marriage, Holy Matrimony is one of the seven Sacraments requiring every Catholic to receive (1) sacramental preparation at least six months in advance to the wedding, and (2) the witness of valid Catholic clergy (3) celebrated inside a Catholic Church.

In regards to the wonderful and exciting August opening of "The Lancaster at St. Clair" Frankfort event center, which was our former downtown worship site and is no longer a Catholic Church, Catholic weddings may only be celebrated inside a Catholic Church, unless a Catholic has obtained a "Dispensation from Canonical Form" from her/his local Catholic bishop and pastor. Any wedding of a Catholic without having this Canonical permission granted previous to his/her wedding would be considered an illicit and invalid union by the Catholic Church on which a Catholic also, by this defiant or unknowing act, automatically separates him/herself from union with the Catholic Church. Such a former Catholic, therefore, may not receive any of the sacraments unless sacramental reconciliation and a convalidation of their wedding are sought and celebrated. Therein, the Catholic Church will joyfully bless the matrimonial unions of her children according to Bible's and the Church's teachings on marriage.
