Students in the First Grade or Younger: *Children must be in a religious education program for a minimum of one year before being allowed to prepare for First Reconciliation and First Holy Eucharist. If your child will be in the second grade in the 2016-17 school year, and is a baptized Catholic, please make sure they are in a religious education program this year or they will not be allowed to prepare for First Reconciliation and First Holy Eucharist in the second grade.*

Students in the Second Grade: *Second grade is the traditional age for sacramental preparation for First Reconciliation and First Holy Eucharist. If a child has not been participating in a religious education program before the second grade, they will need a year of religious education before they are able to prepare for First Reconciliation and First Holy Eucharist.*

Students in the Third Grade or Older: *Must have a minimum of one year in a religious education program the year prior to preparation for First Reconciliation, First Holy Eucharist, and Confirmation. For our middle school students—participation in Youth Life is considered religious education. **Participation in religious education between First Holy Eucharist and Confirmation better prepares our Good Shepherd students to receive the formation and preparation for Confirmation.***

Students in Eighth Grade or Older: *Students must be in a religious education program the year prior to preparing for Confirmation in the ninth grade or later. (Youth Life is considered a religious education program.)*

RECONCILIATION/SACRAMENT OF CONFESSION

Our Catholic church treasures the sacrament of reconciliation. Many parishes offer a communal celebration of penance especially during Advent and Lent. But private reconciliation is usually available every week of the year. If you'd like to celebrate the sacrament of reconciliation, here's what to do:

Prepare. Prayerfully recall your sins. Some will be specifications. Some represent a more general pattern of behavior.

Go to the priest. Visit when he's in the reconciliation room at your parish or ask for an appointment. You may either kneel anonymously behind a screen or sit in a chair where you may speak face to face.

Be welcome. You and the priest may greet each other. Make the Sign of the Cross. He may urge you to have confidence in God. You may indicate the interval since your last confession or anything that will help. Just use common sense. Either you or the priest may read from Scripture.

Confess your sins. Some penitents begin with a formula like, "Bless me, Father, for I have sinned." But you don't have to. Let the priest know your sins. You may discuss the sins you confess so the priest can give you the best counsel.

Receive a penance. The priest will recommend some action after you leave to indicate to God the sincerity in your heart. Usually he suggests prayer or self-denial. If it sounds difficult, let me know.

Pray for forgiveness. The priest may invite you to say a prayer of sorrow aloud. If you remember the Act of Contrition, you may use it. But you may also speak simply from your heart. Receive absolution. This is the best part. The priest proclaims absolution, and God forgives your sins.

Conclude. The priest may say, "Give thanks to the Lord for he is good." If so, answer, "His mercy endures forever." Or he may conclude informally.

Change! Go forth, and with God's help, begin to live a new life of freedom from the slavery of sin!

As a result of gleaning this season, it felt like Christmas morning at Frankfort's Saint Vincent de Paul's Food Pantry Saturday morning. With the abundance of fresh lettuce gleaned from UK Farm along with produce and food from Wal-Mart and Kroger, the recipients overflowed with joyfulness and cheerfulness! The needy helped themselves to the abundance of commodities with infinite gratitude! Their appreciation makes the labor of harvesting and community organizing well worthwhile! I told them "God is good...all the time," and they agreed!

A touching story from Judy Isaacs Collins, parishioner and lead volunteer cook at the ACCESS Soup Kitchen: "All the cooking went according to plan, and the barbecued ribs turned out especially tender and tasty! But the high point of my day occurred when a sweet faced little girl of about 9 or 10 turned to me as I was eating and began telling me how delicious those ribs were. I could tell she was sincere by the amount of smeared barbecue sauce on her face. With her second helping of ribs still in hand she stopped eating long enough to say that the food at most soup kitchens wasn't that good, but this food was the best she had ever eaten. She also told me she almost didn't come today because she wasn't feeling well, but she decided to come because there wasn't much food in her house. When I asked if she was feeling better her reply was "Oh, yes!" Feeding the hungry never felt better!"

ENVELOPES - VISITOR ENVELOPES- LOOSE CHECKS

Won't you help us? We are very grateful for all the financial support we receive from you, our generous parishioners.

However, the amount of checks not placed in a numbered envelope is increasing. By not using your numbered envelope, a "loose" check has to be manually listed, with each check/name having to be looked up in the data system before it can be processed. Occasionally, the name on a check does not match the name in the system...this results in a guessing game as our volunteers and staff try to post the donation.

The "visitor" envelopes are used as convenience in the event that occasionally you should forget your numbered envelope...to use them regularly, again results in the same process as a "loose" check, and we as a parish still have to pay for the numbered envelopes.

Please, when at all possible, we ask that you use your numbered envelope. It makes things so much more efficient and guarantees that you are receiving the proper credit for the tithes that you offer to the church. Thanks for your consideration and help.
