Students in the First Grade or Younger: Children must be in a religious education program for a minimum of one year before being allowed to prepare for First Reconciliation and First Holy Eucharist. If your child will be in the second grade in the 2016-17 school year, and is a baptized Catholic, please make sure they are in a religious education program this year or they will not be allowed to prepare for First Reconciliation and First Holy Eucharist in the second grade.

Students in the Second Grade: Second grade is the traditional age for sacramental preparation for First Reconciliation and First Holy Eucharist. If a child has not been participating in a religious education program before the second grade, they will need a year of religious education before they are able to prepare for First Reconciliation and First Holy Eucharist.

Students in the Third Grade or Older: Must have a minimum of one year in a religious education program the year prior to preparation for First Reconciliation, First Holy Eucharist, and Confirmation. For our middle school students—participation in Youth Life is considered religious education. Participation in religious education between First Holy Eucharist and Confirmation better prepares our Good Shepherd students to receive the formation and preparation for Confirmation.

Students in Eighth Grade or Older: Students must be in a religious education program the year prior to preparing for Confirmation in the ninth grade or later. (Youth Life is considered a religious education program.)

THE COLLECTION

The weekly collection humbly expresses the community's faith. The silent routine accompanies the spirit of selflessness that unites believers. Whether your gift is large or small, the collection expresses what we have in common, a desire to share.



In the Mass, the collection occurs at the beginning of the Liturgy of the Eucharist. Its placement is significant. It is not an admission fee to get into the building. It is part of the heart of the Mass. Every Mass celebrates the sacrifice of Christ on the cross. That sacrifice unfolds before our eyes as the gifts we bring, the bread and wine, are transformed into the Body and Blood of Christ and offered to God.

That material aid is no small matter. Your church depends on your gift. Parishes receive money like beggars, not like clerks. People give not to receive a product; they give to make a gift. The charity that underlies the collection results from faith. We believe that what we have comes from God, and we know it was given for the enjoyment of all. A habit of giving comes from a heart that has learned the satisfactions of generosity. A habit of giving offers us peace that we are doing our part to make the world a better, more generous place.

The Scriptures recommend a tithe – giving 10 percent of what we earn to charities. By giving from what we receive, we share God's love with the world.

Genesis 28:20-22 – After the vision of God's renewed covenant, Jacob initiates a covenant with God vowing to give him a tithe of what he receives from the promised land.

Respect Life Members will glean on Friday, June 26 and Friday, July 3. “One in six Kentuckians do not know the source of their next meal, and one in five are children. The food insecurity rate in Kentucky is 17.2%, which represents almost 750,000 individuals. Our goal for the next several years is simple: increase the number of people we serve. In order to achieve this goal we need to recruit more volunteers and develop more sources of food to glean. In combination, these two resources will allow GleanKY to reach more individuals.”
